



Dear Warren Delivery Site Growers,

August 10, 2026

Here is the 2026 Truck Haul information for Warren.

Warren will prepile during the 3rd shift rotation this year. This is set for August 19–20 and August 26–27. As always, this is subject to change. Warren is under the Crookston Harvest District, so please check the website for updates and changes.

This year, there will be **2 groups** for prepiling sugarbeets into Warren. The enclosed prepile sheet will tell you which group you are in for delivery.

Group 1 is projected to start on **Wednesday, August 19th**, at 8:00 a.m. You will be able to haul on August 19th and 20th. Please do not line up early at startup times so we can avoid trucks backing up on the highway.

Group 2 will start on **Wednesday, August 26th**. You will be able to haul on August 26th and 27th.

For growers with more than 40% of their planted acres going to Warren: You will be able to haul in both prepile groups. You will be able to haul on August 19th, 20th, 26th, and 27th. It is encouraged that you start right away on August 19th to make sure you get in your quota and help manage truck numbers in both groups.

Prepile quota is currently set at **5.14 tons/acre**.

Prepile truck allowance will be based on 70% of your total trucks per your shift as either a 12- or 24-hour grower. There will be a minimum of 2 trucks per grower for the prepile timeframe. The enclosed Warren 2026 Prepile sheet shows the number of trucks you will be allowed during prepile in the right column. Trucks will be counted, so please use your allotted number of trucks for an efficient prepile.

The 70% truck allotment for prepile only is intended to eliminate long lines extending onto Highway 75, which create a hazardous situation, and to improve turnaround time at the site.

The prepile page also shows your prepile quota for the Warren piling site. It is your requirement to deliver this quota since your acres have been contracted to this site. If you want someone else to haul your prepile quota, please let Thomas Cymbaluk know as soon as possible, and he will assist with other possible arrangements.

The “scale out” slips that are given to drivers on the “out” scale show your accumulating tons on the bottom, so you know your accumulated quota after every load delivered. Keep the rotobeater close to the lifter to meet your quota. **Rotobeating beyond your quota does not guarantee you will be able to deliver those tons.**

*** Warren has a 2-truck minimum for a 12-hour grower. The 2-truck, 12-hour minimum grower will have a 12-hour schedule that rotates each year. If a 2-truck minimum grower wants to be a 24-hour grower, they would only get one 24-hour truck sticker. ***

The truck allocation is shown based on past 12- and 24-hour grower information. Please check your other sites to make sure that shifts to other stations match up on the same times and designations. If there is any discrepancy, please let Thomas Cymbaluk know as soon as possible for corrections.

**** Reminder:** Trucks will need to go straight forward to get tare dirt after dumping beets—most drivers are doing this already. The option of backing up toward the piler, under the tare dirt conveyor, will **no longer** be accepted due to safety concerns for the ground crew and future plans for piler automation. We will continue to train and emphasize tare dirt placement to the back of the truck box.

Truck turnaround time is important to all of us. Under truck specs, please check your trucks for the following:

Hoist Guidelines: • 30 seconds hoist downtime for tandems and triples • 45 seconds hoist downtime for semis

Total Unloading Time: • Tandems - 2.25 minutes • Tri-axles - 2.75 minutes • Semis - 3.50 minutes

Check the dump valves on the trucks and make sure drivers are aware of how to operate this function when lowering boxes.

Recommendations to help maintain faster turnaround times in Warren:

1. Have trucks stay closer to the end dumps while waiting to go onto the piler when there is no need for trucks to back through the end dumps. This really helps improve turnaround times.
2. If your farm has a relatively large number of trucks compared with other growers, check with other larger growers to see if there are opportunities to be at another site on the same day(s). Long truck lines increase truck turnaround times and cost you more money.

A driver training video is still available on the ACSC website to train and refresh drivers.

IMPORTANT: ** Be sure to have your stickers on your trucks before stockpile starts. ******
